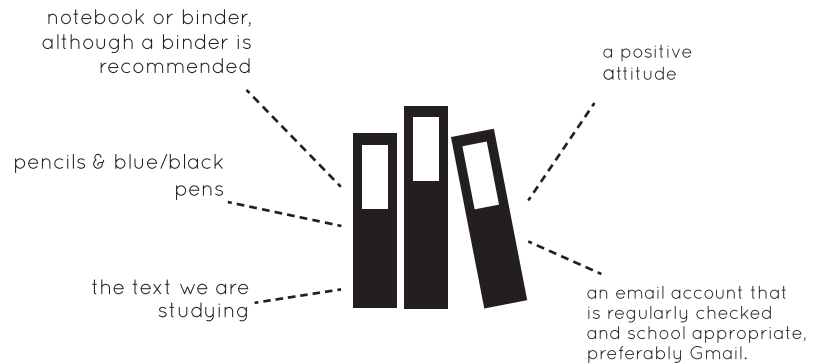

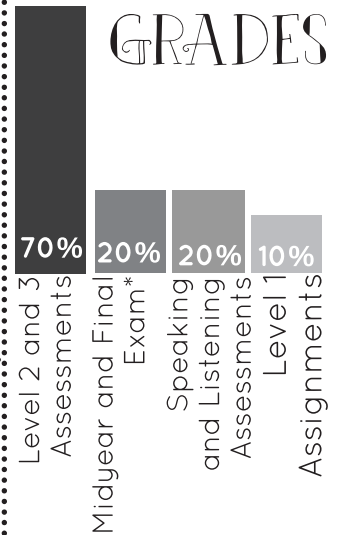
REQUIRED RESOURCES



COURSE DESCRIPTION

This class is designed to improve your reading, writing, and communication skills, as well as help you develop a greater understanding and appreciation for American literature and culture. Though an emphasis will be placed on developing college and workplace-related reading and writing skills, we will also explore philosophical ideas related to the identity of an individual, the identity of a society, specifically American society, and how individuals shape and are shaped by their background, experiences and interactions with society.

RULES AND EXPECTATIONS

* **Be nice!** Students will maintain a respectful and positive attitude toward the teacher and classmates.

* **Be on time!** Students must arrive on time. Students who are more than two minutes tardy will makeup the time with Ms. Volta after school.

To avoid miscommunication, no bathroom passes will be allowed until the daily warm-up is completed.

* **Be organized** Students must keep a copy of graded assessments in their portfolio in the classroom.

* **Be ready to work!** Students must arrive on time with their binder, homework, novel, and writing utensils. Students must start the warm-up immediately upon arriving to class.

* **Be present!** If you happen to be absent, you are responsible for getting the work you missed. However, **Mental attendance** is also mandatory in this class, so **cell phones must be kept away or in provided slots.** Habitual instances of active non-participation (sleeping, using phone, etc.) will result in the student being asked to leave. There will be times phones will be permitted for educational purposes at the teacher's discretion. The charging of cell phones in class is a privilege for students who have completed their work.

* **Be a student!** It is important for students to understand that grades largely reflect mastery and not work ethic. Certainly, work ethic helps students learn and improve upon the skills we are working on to help them achieve higher academic success, but does not guarantee an A.

Level 2 and 3 Assessments consist of summative assessments: essays and projects. Late assignments are encouraged to be submitted, but will be subject to a penalty.

Level 1 Assignments consist of formative assessments: nightly reading homework and notes. These assignments will be checked daily and will not be accepted late.

Speaking and Listening Assessments consist of both summative and formative assessments: class participation and presentations, both formal and informal. The acceptance of late work will depend on the nature of the assessment.

*During Term 2, the **Midyear Exam** will count as 20% of a student's grade. The other categories will adjust accordingly.

PLAGIARISM: WHAT IS IT AND HOW TO AVOID IT.

Plagiarism is defined as taking ideas and writings of another and passing them off as one's own. Plagiarism is cheating!

Plagiarism includes...

- 1 turning in someone else's paper as your own
- 2 copying from a friend
- 3 failing to cite a source
- 4 using sources like Spark Notes, Shmoop, etc., as a replacement for reading and analyzing.



- *The teacher will notify the administration and contact parents if cheating is suspected.
- *The student will be given a failing grade for that particular test, assignment, or for the grading period.
- *A plagiarism report will be filed and attached to the student's academic record.

HOMEWORK POLICIES



***LATE WORK:** L2s&L3s will be accepted up to a week late with **penalty**. L1s are not accepted late.

* ESSAY REWRITES:

Students must meet with me within **two days** of receiving their grade and **have completed all preliminary work** on time to be eligible to rewrite.

* MISPLACED BOOKS OR

PACKETS: PDFs of novels and packets are available on the class website. Additional copies will not be given; students must print new copies or complete electronically. Students will be financially responsible for lost books.



***LIFE HAPPENS!** If you are having issues at school or at home, or realize you need more time to complete your absolute best work for any other reason, **request an extension**. You must come talk to Ms. Volta or e-mail her at least **two days** before the assignment is due and **have completed all preliminary work** for the extension to be granted. Emails sent the night before an assignment is due requesting an extension will not be granted and will be ignored.



*L2/L3 Assessments must be typed in **MLA Format**. In addition to the library and computer labs, many smart phones feature word processors (Notes, Pages, Google Doc, Word, etc.)

* E-SUBMISSION POLICY:

Students must upload L2/L3 Assessments onto Turnitin, and bring in a paper copy for their portfolio. Printer and Internet issues are not an excuse for late work. If technology fails, hand-write your assignment and turn it in during class.

NOTICE...

ASPEN is updated daily. Students should access their account regularly, and see us regarding concerns. This can be done **before or after class**. Please note, a mark of "no grade" on ASPEN is not a zero. It simply means the assignment has not yet been graded.

ABSENTEE POLICY
